To the Candidates in the Acadia First Nation 2015 Election

Dear Candidates:

I have been directed by the Chief Electoral Officer for the Acadia First Nation 2015 Election, to write this letter to you.

As advised at the Nomination Meeting, the Election Bylaws stipulate in Bylaw 10 that a person convicted of an indictable offence is not eligible for elected Band Office for a period of not less than 3 years.

This means that any person who has been convicted of an indictable offence in the last 3 years cannot run in this election.

Each candidate must provide to me at the address shown above, a Criminal Record Check by the close of the business day on May 25, 2015. If your Criminal Record Check shows that you have been convicted of an indictable offence in the last 3 years, you will be removed from the ballot.

If you do not provide me with a Criminal Record Check by the close of the business day on May 25, 2015, you will also be removed from the ballot.

It is your responsibility to make sure that I receive the Criminal Record Check. In the event there is any doubt of my receipt of it, please contact me to confirm. I will not be contacting you to check on whether you sent it or to remind you of this requirement.
