

Species at Risk Fieldworker: Wildcat/Ponhook/Medway

The Kespukwitk Species at Risk program is looking for a fieldworker for the Wildcat/Ponhook areas with possible assistance to colleagues along the Medway in the region.

Seasonal/term employment:

\$13.5/hour for 34 hours/week

14 weeks between July – October, 2017

The duties of the job include, but are not limited to:

- Monitoring sites for the Eastern Ribbonsnake
- Assisting biologists looking for Eastern Ribbonsnakes and Blanding's Turtles
- Surveying reserve lands for turtles, rare plants, and birds
- Survey and document community members' rare species sightings

Requirements:

- Good knowledge and experience in the specific landscapes of the Wildcat/Ponhook region
- Ability to identify various plants/trees and animals
- Willing to learn new fieldwork and species identification techniques
- Work well independently and in a team
- Able to work long days in various weather conditions and possibly walk long distances through difficult terrain
- Valid drivers' license and access to a vehicle
