Re: Unsightly Premises By-Law

The Acadia First Nation is committed to achieving sustainability in its Housing Program. We do not have enough houses for our Band Members and the condition of the houses we do have is very important to us.

Like you, we take great pride in our communities. We are stewards of the limited assets available to our Band.

There are a few homes in our communities that are unsightly and require cleanup . To deal with this, the Acadia First Nation passed an Unsightly Premises By-Law on May 23, 2017.

In the next short while, letters will be going out to houses that we consider to be unsightly, giving the residents of those particular houses an opportunity to clean up the adjacent area themselves. If they do not do so, the Acadia First Nation has the power to complete the clean-up and to charge the cost of doing that to the person to whom the house is allocated.

For most of you, this is for your information only, so that you are up-to-date on what our Band is doing. Some of you, however, will receive a second letter detailing the clean up work that we expect you to do under the Unsightly Premises By-Law.
