The Kespukwitk Species at Risk program is looking for a stewardship coordinator to work out of the Wildcat office.

- Organize community events surrounding ecology and rare species
- Facilitate youth nature workshops and events
- Create communication materials for distribution among Mi'kmaw communities in Kespukwitk
- Work with the Species At Risk Project Manager to collect community input and draft planning documents
- Create and carry out community surveys
- Assist fieldworkers when required

- Good communicator and writer
- Can positively engage youth in outdoor or creative activities
- Can take initiative to create new events and materials
- Priority will be given to applicants who are Aboriginal/ Members of Acadia First Nation Band
- Ability to identify various plants/trees and animals
- Work well independently and in a team

- Valid criminal record check and vulnerable sector clearance
